**Jindřich Vobořil,** National Drug Coordinator of the Czech Republic, director of a department, executive deputy chair and a head of the Secretariat of the Government Council for Drug Policy, Coordination, Prague.

Jindřich Vobořil worked first in geriatric nursing, before founding and becoming Chief Executive of the drugs services organization Podane Ruce, currently operating in four districts of the Czech Republic. Since 2000 he has conducted number of consultancies and trainings in the area of drugs services development and a drugs policy: Afghanistan, Kyrgyzstan, Ecuador, Bolivia, Colombia, Peru, Russia, Serbia, Hungary working for UNODC, GTZ (GIZ today) EU delegation, Soros Foundation OSI and for various agencies as a subcontractor. He also lectures at Charles University Prague, Medical Faculty and the Faculty of Social Sciences, Masaryk University, Brno.



He is a member and a deputy executive chair of the Czech Government Council for drugs, alcohol, tobacco and gambling industries; a member of the Management Board, EMCDDA; and member of HDG Group - Horizontal Working Party on Drugs.
